As well as promoting positive relationships between the Towns Councillors, our partners and the community, and promote fairness as being the priority in delivering services for the Community.

The Deputy Mayor Councillor Malcolm Randle will support the Mayor for the coming year. Councillor Randle has served Great Dawley as Town Councillor since 2015, and said he is really looking forward to supporting both the Mayor and the community of Great Dawley during the next year.

The first official engagement for the new Mayor of Great Dawley will be to preside over the event that bestows the status of Honorary Freeman of Great Dawley to Paul Sanderson and Jenny Athersmith. The date and details of the event to be confirmed.

The role of Mayor is an important role within Great Dawley, not only does it chair the Town Council meetings but the mayor is usually the council spokesperson and has a significant ceremonial role at events, including Honorary Freedom ceremonies.

The Chair, Councillor Shaun Davies, has been elected as chair for the Executive Committee meetings and to discharge Town Council business and decisions. Councillor Davies said that he is looking forward to another great year for the parish of Great Dawley especially with this year electing its first Mayor and Deputy Mayor. As well as there being an increase in the number of events being held both in our community buildings, across the community and with the Town Council continuing with the grants being offered to local community groups to enhance the wonderful work already taking place.



Honorary Freeman

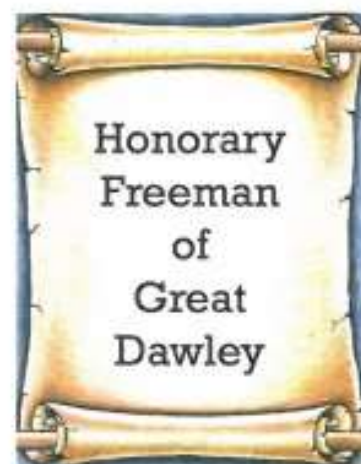
Part of the legislation that governs a Town Council entitles the Parish to grant the status of honorary freeman and this is no different in Great Dawley. Many Town Councils across the Country bestow this age old honour on a persons of distinction and persons who have, in the opinion of the council, rendered eminent services to the local area.

At a specially convened meeting of Great Dawley Town Council held on Monday 9th May 2016, a resolution was passed to bestow the honorary freeman of Great Dawley to both Jenny Athersmith and Paul Sanderson.

Paul Sanderson is the former headmaster of Ladygrove Primary School, and has been recognised for his tireless work for the community over a number of years. These include being an active resident, local Headmaster and a Director of the Dawley Regeneration Partnership.

Jenny Athersmith was a founder member of the Parish Council in 1988. She has been a Councillor for Great Dawley for over 30 years and retired last year from the council after serving the community as both Vice-Chair and part of the entertainment committee.

Over 21 million people are currently volunteering in the UK, all making a huge contribution to local communities and peoples lives.

These 21 million people are a shining example of how we can all make a big difference to individuals and communities every day from improving the environment we live in, spending time with those who may otherwise be lonely and contributing to a range of other essential services and support. We are very fortunate to have a number of amazing volunteers who work incredibly hard all year round within our Parish. Great Dawley Town Council are really committed in supporting our volunteers and are really pleased to have now developed our own volunteer handbook and guidance to help us recruit and manage our volunteers in the future.

As part of National Volunteers Week held in June we wanted to share with you a great example of a local volunteer:

Every Thursday morning Busarin volunteers at Dawley Town Hall to run a Children & Family Parent led Playgroup for Parents with children aged 0-5 to come along to, whilst the children have time to play the parents can also have a chat or get advice and support they need regarding their children.

Busarin has lived in Dawley for over 13 years and first starting to come along to the group with her own children, having found the sessions really supportive to herself she decided to take the

opportunity to complete the training on offer and become involved as a volunteer.



Busarin said "Volunteering has really helped me in developing my own skills and confidence, and should hopefully help me in the future when I'm ready to return back into the workplace. Being a Mum has enabled me to really understand and relate to the challenges that being a Parent brings. Being a local Mum who regularly attends other groups with my own children this has really been helpful in building good relationships with other parents, and not being seen as a 'Professional' but as another Mum who can fully relate to how they are feeling. I would highly recommend it!

The Playgroup sessions are run twice weekly every Monday and Thursday 9.30-11am at Dawley Town Hall for Parents or Grandparents with Children aged 0-5 years.

We hope Busarins story will inspire you and others to get involved. This Summer we also want to encourage you to take up

a range of volunteering opportunities available. There is a great choice locally, but sometimes people aren't aware of them or they have a particular perception of what volunteering is about. There are many local groups, clubs and charities looking for people. Here at Great Dawley Town Council we are always looking for volunteers to help us deliver our services to the community, see below a few examples of our current vacancies:

- **Support to our Community Garden - Planting & Growing Vegetables, Watering, General Gardening - Nothing too strenuous!**
- **Great Dawley Dinner - General help in the kitchen, preparing food, washing up, serving food.**
- **Stewarding at local events. Help us to set up a local Film Club - 'Dawley Flicks'.**
- **Street Champions - Litter Picking, environmental projects.**

Under 16's Disco

Dawley C of E School Celebrates 175 years

Congratulations to Dawley C of E School. This year marks the 175th year of Dawley Church of England School. The school was originally known as the National School and was founded on February 23rd 1841 with the gift of land by one Richard Slaney for the purpose of establishing a school for local children. It was built on land next to the Parsonage but overshadowed by coal spoil tips. From its foundation in 1841 Dawley C of E School (The National) has been extended and remodelled to accommodate a growing number of children over the years. The school will be holding a special event on Friday 15th June to mark this special occasion.

BMX National Event is coming to Dawley for the weekend - 6th August

Telford's BMX race club will host its debut National round in the British series attracting 3,000 visitors to the town.

Wrekin Riders BMX Race Club, which is solely run by a small team of volunteers, will host the round in the British BMX Series attracting talented world champion BMX stars from across the UK.

The national race which will be held on August 6 and 7 will see more than 900 riders from across the UK travel to Telford to battle it out on the £250,000 track in Dawley.

British Cycling announced Telford and Blackpool as new venues for the national rounds of 2016. The other national rounds have taken place at

Manchester, Birmingham and Scotland and forthcoming ones include Peckham and Derby.

Volunteers from the club based on Duce Drive in Dawley, are now planning for a boom in riders visiting the track in the build up to the British BMX Series as riders often want to ride the track before the national event.

Kieran Edwards, club chairman and head coach at the community club, said: "This is fantastic news for Wrekin Riders and for Telford as a whole".

"To host a national round is a real feather in the cap for Wrekin Riders and will certainly put our track on the map".



"The club has seen a significant increase in riders over the last 12 months including novice riders and expert riders who have been travelling to our club from other areas".

"We have built up a very good reputation as a friendly, welcoming club which prides itself on a high standard of track and coaching for all levels."

Mr Edwards said a lot of work had been carried out at the track by himself and volunteers over the last 12 months.

Wrekin Riders has also secured a corporate sponsorship deal with automotive glazing company National Windscreens.

Jo Edwards, club treasurer, added: "To secure a national round is fantastic but we know there is a lot of work involved between now and then and without our dedicated volunteers this wouldn't be possible.

"Everything we do as a committee we do for the children because seeing their smiling faces as they cross the finishing line and the development in their talent makes it all worth it.

"The novice sessions every Saturday and Sunday have become very successful and

over the last 12 months we have seen children as young as four years old progress from novice to expert regional racing who are now looking forward to their first season of national racing in 2016.

"For those youngsters to be able to race on their home track at national level is brilliant.

"Whilst our teenage and adult riders include some of the best in the UK who act as perfect role models to the younger riders."

British Cycling's cycle sport manager Jonathan Day said: "We're delighted to be able to announce the dates for the British BMX Series for 2016.

"The BMX National Series is the pinnacle of the British Cycling

BMX events calendar and provides a great spectacle for the sport"

"The series also gives opportunities for riders to take part and enjoy competing in this fantastic sport at the highest level in this country."

Dawley Community Music Project 2016

This Pride project is funded as part of Telford and Wrekin Councils initiative which seeks to enhance and promote our borough market town High streets.



Great Dawley Town Council are delighted to be working on this exciting new project with the Lead Organisation: Friends of Dawley Park.

The idea is to develop the potential of the latent talent across the community of the Dawley area to engage in music making and singing through workshops leading to performance.

Since 2013 the Friends of Dawley Park have had the desire, supported through consultation, to help develop some form of fringe Festival in the Town and have consistently restated this ambition. The projects success will hinge on the enthusiasm of local people. There is an enormous amount of goodwill in the Town at present and this 'pilot' project is posed to capture this and make the whole venture accessible to all.

A project start up team is being developed with representative from the parish council, social club, schools and Telford and Wrekin creative development team. Which will seek to recruit local people and draw in musicians to help with the workshops and performances at both indoor and outdoor high street venues. This will happen alongside existing musical activities and compliment them:

The scene will be set with the project team, local venues and participants, and artists ready to perform what they have learnt and the ambitious audience target is 500 new visitors to this new event in Dawley.

Unfortunately amongst others, Dawley Library has been identified as one of the services which Telford & Wrekin Council can no longer afford to run, both the Borough Council and the Town Council doesn't want to see our library close and are currently working together to look at whether the Library Service in Dawley could be taken on by Great Dawley Town Council, the details of this are still being discussed between both Councils.

It has been really encouraging that local residents have already been talking to us and offering their help to ensure this valuable service continues.
