#PRH4Me

Great Dawley Town Council has shown its support to the #PRH4Me campaign.

A cross party unanimous vote was resolved at the Full Council meeting of Great Dawley Town Council on Monday 10th October 2016 to support the campaign opposing any downgrading of services at the Princess Royal Hospital as this would be detrimental to the residents in this area. Great Dawley Town Council fully supports the #PRH4Me campaign, the PRH and the services it provides, and wishes to show how valued the hospital is in this town and encourage residents to also pledge their support for the PRH.

The campaign #PRH4Me was launch in March 2016 to gather pledges of support from people to keep the hospital services and show support to the PRH. This was as a result of NHS bosses wanting to move the new and very successful Women & Children's Centre and A&E services from the PRH to Shrewsbury.

The £28 million Women & Children's Centre opened only two years ago and Telford was chosen for this because clinically it was the best location.

Telford & Wrekin is one of the fastest growing areas in the region and so retaining full A&E services is also vital.

After the disappointment of this year's attempt to swim the English Channel by Ian Preece which was cut short by the weather and safety reasons, we can confirm that Ian Preece and Team Webb have booked in to have another go.

Following a month of talking it over Ian Preece and Team Webb have the 1st August 2017 booked. The team have been lucky to book the team that took David Walliams across the channel and have been given a nine day weather window.

Ian Preece said 'I've done a lot of soul-searching this past month and I'm ready to give it another shot. It's only right, after all the hard work & donations people have been putting in, I'm ready and I have all the backing of the fantastic team. I'm more determined than ever! Believe it or not, it took Captain Webb a second attempt'.

Ian and Team Webb are raising funds to support and maintain a local football academy project for people with disabilities. This project offers free sport, football & education to kids and adults with disabilities and gives kids and teenagers that come from deprived backgrounds the chance to be part of something positive, as well as giving them guidance, education and learn valuable social skills in the process.

Great Dawley Town Council are very proud that Councillor San Sekhon has been given the honour for her many years of charity work in both the community of Dawley, the town of Telford and in India, particularly in sponsoring the school and education programme in the village where she was born.

An MBE is an award given by the Queen to an individual for outstanding service to the community or local 'hands on' service. The definition of MBE is Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire.

Councillor Sekhon was born in India in 1949 and travelled to England in 1960 with her husband Peter to build a new life, first living in Coventry and then moving to Wolverhampton before settling in Telford in 1984 where they opened a shop in Eyton Road, Dawley which they both ran for nearly 20 years. Councillor Sekhon has 2 children, Jane and Tony and 3 grandchildren.

Councillor Sekhon became a local councillor for the



community of Great Dawley in 2003 as well as supporting a number of charities by raising money and awareness of their excellent work including Severn Hospice, Macmillan Nurses, PRH and the sheltered housing at Buxton Road, Dawley.

Councillor Sekhon has also supported the gurdwara in Hadley with the support and development of the Khusdil group, this is a group that meets every Thursday with over 40 ladies at the Sikh temple Hadley. This group gives the ladies an opportunity to meet and discuss health, healthy practices in the home, participate in weekly yoga

in weekly yoga classes and also have their blood pressure taken by the health visitor. Different food is cooked every week and the ladies are encouraged to go on trips outside of the community to reduce isolation.

Councillor Sekhon said 'I have so many thank yous to give but would like to say an especially big thank you to the people of Dawley who have supported me and my family during both the good times and bad times and for making us so welcome in the community. Thank you also to the Councillors and colleagues of Great Dawley for their support. Thank you to people from Hadley and the community there who have supported me, particularly with the parade 'nagar kirtan'. I still go to visit the ICU at PRH every year to thank the doctors and staff with chocolates and a card, without the care and work by this ICU team at the PRH my husband Peter would not be here today.'

Councillor Sekhon will be attending the awards ceremony at the palace in the new year.

Neighbourhood Officer

Hi I'm Sue Williams, the new Neighbourhood Officer for Great Dawley Town Council. My job involves walking and driving around the Dawley and Malinslee neighbourhoods daily looking for things that could be improved in the environment that will help to make the area a pleasant place to live.

For example, just recently I arranged for some work to be carried out by our Parish Environmental Team (PET) in Holy Trinity Church in Dawley after we'd received some complaints about how overgrown it had become. The before and after photographs show just how much work was done and how much better it looks.

I also report fly tips, overhanging branches, dog mess, litter, graffiti, broken glass, weeds and much more

All these issues are either reported to Telford and Wrekin Council where their staff then deal with the problem, or much more likely our own PET or street sweeper will do the work.

When I report any issues I find, I almost always use the Telford and Wrekin Everyday App which is available for anyone. It's very easy and involves just taking a photo of the fly tip or whatever on your mobile phone and pressing submit. The app knows where you are so you don't even need to know the name of the street! If you see me walking around your neighbourhood, please feel free to come and chat to me about any concerns you may have.

Over the last few months I've also

been involved with Great Dawley's Gardening Service where we do basic maintenance work such as lawn cutting, hedge trimming and general tidying for our elderly or disabled residents. If you think you might be eligible for this service which starts again next year, please feel free to contact me here at Dawley Town Hall.

Library is on the move in Great Dawley

The Library is on the move in Dawley, Great Dawley Town Council have agreed to deliver the redesigned library service that has been affected by the reduced government grant and cuts in services being provided currently by Telford & Wrekin Council, this will see the library currently located in the Langley School being relocated into Dawley House, Burton Street, Dawley.

The Library will now be called 'Great Dawley Community Library'.



The new library will open in Dawley House in mid-January and the books are to be moved before then. All the services currently offered at the Langley School will be available at Dawley House.

Great Dawley Town Council want to work with the local community and hope this library will be supported with new volunteers from the local area.
